## Backgrounder 4<sup>th</sup> Annual SAI-SECFS Golf Tournament Fundraiser

The 'Bimatoowag Wabishke Maiingain', Running White Wolves, Youth Council is a joint initiative between Shawenim Abinoojii Inc. (SAI) and Southeast Child & Family Services (SECFS). 12 First Nations youth ages 15 to 25 represent eight Southeast First Nations in Manitoba including *Poplar River, Berens River, Bloodvein, Brokenhead, Little Grand Rapids, Pauingassi, Black River and Hollow Water*. The Youth Council advises, guides, and directs the organizations' programs, services, and approaches to working with children, youth, and families. The purpose of the Youth Council is to build on leadership skills and empower cultural identity as Anishinaabe leaders.

Last year's Golf Tournament Fundraiser raised \$57,000. The funds raised supported quarterly gatherings for youth to learn from Knowledge Keepers and Elders, as well as participate in ceremony, teachings, and land-based activities. Here were the dates:

- 1) Summer – Knowles Centre in Whiteshell, MB
- 2) Fall – Camp Manitou
- 3) Winter – Grey Buffalo Grandfather Wellness Lodge and Brokenhead Ojibway Nation

This year's fundraiser will continue support for our young people from the Southeast First Nations region to experience leadership opportunities with the mentorship and guidance of Elders from their home communities. In the upcoming summer months, Youth Council members will help staff and local resources facilitate community-based programs and events such as Youth Summer Day Camps, Family Camps, and Treaty Days activities. Youth will take the lead in guiding and delivering programs and work with staff to encourage and build a positive working relationship with regional entities and First Nations communities working to serve our children, youth, and families. Funds raised through this year's tournament will go towards empowering the leadership capacity of our Running White Wolves Youth Council by giving them opportunities to support their home First Nations, and to learn through engaging with Elders and Knowledge Keepers from their region. These community-based initiatives support identity, community development, and strengthen connections.

The Running White Wolves and SAI-SECFS Fundraising Committee thank you for your contributions to making a positive impact and supporting youth leadership development.
